Current plans are to review waiting restrictions in 2011/12 for implementation in 2012/13. However the process could be expedited if the Parish Council was willing to pay the costs of £3000.

10. To consider commenting on proposals to change speed limits on the A370

The proposals would result in the Strawberry Line traffic-light crossing being in a 40 mph zone rather than 30 mph.

11. To consider appointing representatives to the Annual General Meeting of Avon Local Councils Association

Thursday 14 October, 6.30, Filton. Among other business the Executive Committee is recommending a 23% increase in subscription (currently £1301). The Executive Committee will consider dissolving the Association unless current member stay in and members which have left re-join, all paying the increased subscription.
