Burglary Awareness!

Burglars are targeting homes for cash, watches & high-value jewellery. Please help to keep your area safe by reporting suspicious activity. Call 999 if a crime is in progress/suspects are still in the area. Otherwise ring 101.

You can deter burglars by:

- Keeping side gates locked and storing tools and ladders securely
- Ensuring doors and windows are closed and locked if you're not in the room
- Locking up and setting the alarm, if you have one, when it gets dark as well as when you go out
- Keeping cash in a bank, building society or post office
- Using a specialist storage firm or safety deposit box for high value jewellery
- If you do use a safe, investing in a good quality one that's professionally fitted to a solid wall or floor
- Keeping a record of your valuables including a photo and short description
- Wherever possible, installing and using burglar alarms, CCTV and smart doorbells
- Joining or setting up **Neighbourhood Watch**


Bike marking Saturday 29th January

E-Bikes and E-Scooters

Your local Neighbourhood Policing team just wanted to remind you before you buy an E-Scooter with your Christmas money or got one as a gift, there are laws around the use of them and we will hopefully save you wasting money.

We expect many of you will have seen them on the roads in larger cities which are piloting a scheme and the rules that when hiring these a driving license is needed to hire them and insurance is covered under the rental full details about these pilot schemes can be found on:-

We have had a look on some online retail outlets and there is very little info about the law and some of them have links to look at with regards to the law and we understand that some people don't read the small print so we thought it would be good for a timely reminder

<u>Legal Warning – E scooter law - not to be used on public roads, cycle</u> paths or pavements. Only on private land with the landowners consent.

POWERED TRANSPORTERS



The term powered transporters overest a variety or inverse personal fransport devices which are mechanically propelled (propelled by a motor) as well as or instead of being manually propelled. It Inclus e-scoolers, Segways, hoverboards, go-peds (combustion engine-powered kilck-scoolers), powered unicycles, and u-wheels.

There is no separate legislation covering powered transporters, BUT given how they are motorised and designed they fall within the definition and are covered by the same laws and legulations covering all motor vehicles.

ELECTRICALLY ASSISTED PEDAL CYCLE (E.BIKE)

WHAT ARE THEY?

To qualify as a pedal cycle it must...

- A. be fitted with pedals by means of which it is capable of being propelled; and

- be fittled with no motor other than an electric motor which:
 has a maximum continuous rated power which does not exceed 250 wate;
 cannot propel the vehicle when it is traveiling at more than 15.6 miles per hour.
