Niccy who is our Youth Worker from Yatton Youth Club would like to update you on what is going on there.

“Juniors is very popular with 30-40 at each session which is 6-715pm Tuesday and Thursdays. Supper club Wednesday’s 630-9pm is proving expensive, with ingredients, but worth it as it has had an impact on antisocial behaviour in Yatton.

Seniors took a hard hit after lockdown but is gradually building up and we have an average of 15 young people every Thursday 730-9pm.

The Rock youth led Community cafe has moved its time to 12-4pm Saturday’s and sees several customers each week”.

We are currently working towards the Duke of Cornwall Award. This was developed to give young people an opportunity to learn what to do in an emergency situation.
