Shopping in Busy Areas

Busy shopping locations are ideal places for thieves or pickpockets. Remember to keep handbags close to your person and don't hang them on the back of your chairs when you stop for lunch. Don't store a wallet in your rear pocket, or an outer coat pocket, these are much easier to take something from without you noticing.

Valuables in Cars

The usual advice for not leaving valuables on show in cars still applies but is extended to wrapped gifts, you've worked hard to make them appealing to your family and friends, but equally an opportunistic thief.

Bike marking


Saturday 29th January

Scam Awareness

Unfortunately we have recently seen a rise in attempted scams in our area.

I have attached the pdf copy of the book of scams we can give out to vulnerable victims.

Below I will outline some of the most common scams we are seeing.



Carphone warehouse phone calls.

A phone call will be received saying they are calling from Carphone Warehouse, offering you a new phone for a really good price. The handset will arrive and it won't work. Some victims have stated they have received a follow up call to advise them they have sent the wrong handset this one needs to be returned and a replacement will be sent with a free gift. THIS IS NEVER RECEIVED and your money is lost.

Delivery companies.

A text message will be received claiming to be from a delivery company, saying you need to pay an amount for a parcel to be delivered.

This is a well-known scam, your money will be lost and potentially your data stolen.

Bank Account Compromised.

A phone call will be received stating your bank account has been compromised advising you to move your money into an account that has been set up for you.

If you suspect that your account is compromised contact your bank and they will be able to help. Don't transfer any money without speaking your bank first.

Below 3 quick steps from Take Five to Stop Fraud.

STOP

Taking a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information could keep you safe.

CHALLENGE

Could it be fake? It's ok to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you.

PROTECT

Contact your bank immediately if you think you've fallen for a scam and report it to Action Fraud.

Radar Gun Training



Your Local Neighbourhood Policing Team enjoyed a day of training in how to use the Radar Speed Guns.

This will allow us to proactively police speeding hotspots and respond to complaints of speeding.

Partnership Working
